Owen Watson, representative for the above mentioned applications stated they are considering the development of 197' meteorological towers. Each tower will be guy wired and everything will be removed when done. The anemometers have orange balls on each end.

Commissioner Willeke asked how long the towers will be in place. Watson the life span is one to ten years but the average is five to seven years. Every two to three years the towers are laid down to do maintenance work on them.

Watson said they will start to install towers in 4-5 weeks. It will be a year before consultants get through the data and give the information to the electric company.

Kuntz stated that the Yuma County Government Communication Tower will be put on the 6.9 acres next to a tower they already have on the property.
